

Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP)

Department of Transitional Assistance The Department of Transitional Assistance (DTA) administers SNAP benefits. SNAP provides a monthly benefit to buy nutritious foods. To get SNAP, you must be of low-income and be a U.S. citizen or legal noncitizen (restrictions apply).
